<sup>\*</sup> Gambling is an activity that implies an element of risk, where money or something of sentimental or monetary value could be won or lost by the participant. Research has shown that gambling activates the reward system in the brain in much the same way that a drug does. There are commonalities between gambling disorders and other addictions (alcohol, tobacco and illicit drugs) among youth and therefore, similar prevention strategies are believed to be effective.




